#### Inner parts

- Steel, blackened, quality 5.8

#### Screw

- Steel, blackened, quality 5.8

### Operation

**By lifting the lever** the serrations are disengaged. The lever can be positioned by the serrations. On releasing the lever, the serrations are automatically re-engaged.
